When the number of runs is reached the Agility Rocks program software will close runs for that day. Please email the trial secretary Hanna Smith @ tralsecretarycaans@gmail.com to request your name and the number of runs requested be added to the waitlist for that day (you do not need to complete an entry) please indicate this in the subject line of your email. Confirmations will be emailed after the entry deadline. Trial closes at midnight on WEDNESDAY, July 3rd or when it is full. If you have not received your confirmation by SATURDAY, July 6th, please email the trial secretary.

Volunteering:

Submission of your entry to this trial indicates your agreement to contribute to the smooth running of the trial. **A link to a google document will be posted for you to sign up for your volunteer jobs after the closing date.**

Measuring:

*** If your dog has a Temporary height card, they **do not** need to be re-measured until they turn 2 years old and at that time will have their permanent ID card signed (requiring 2 official measurements).

Notice to Exhibitors

Exhibitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of current AAC rule and regulations including, but not limited to, the following:

This event will be held in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Agility Association of Canada (AAC). The obstacles shall be chosen from those described in the current edition of the *AAC Official Rules and Regulations* and shall conform to AAC specifications.

All breeds and mixed breeds eighteen months of age and older (No exceptions) are eligible to compete. Blind, lame, or aggressive dogs are ineligible as are dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness that may affect the dog's physical or mental performance (judge's discretion).

Bitches in season (BIS): BIS will now be permitted to participate at the handler's discretion.

- If running a BIS trial secretary must be notified right away at tralsecretarycaans@gmail.com
- BIS movement around the site and interaction with other dogs must be limited
- Competitors will be notified of any BIS and it will be noted next to the dog on running order so competitors and judge are aware
- BIS will run at the end of class
- There will be a designated relief area for bitches in season and when not in this area they must be wearing protective panties
- BIS will not be required to wear protective panties while running but a clean mat must be used at the start line and handlers must bring their own mat
- If handler chooses not to run BIS see refund section

ALL dogs must have an AAC Registration Number before their entries will be accepted in the AAC sanctioned trial, even if to complete FEO. The Dog ID form is available at www.aac.ca. Dogs with numbers pending will not be eligible to compete.

Food will be allowed in the ring during FEO runs only. Food must be in a sealed container with such structure to avoid spillage if dropped, tossed or grabbed by the dog. Handler is not permitted to feed the dog during the run or while in the ring.

Tugging in the ring will now be permitted before and after a run. Tugging can be on a leash or a toy, but the toy must be attached to the leash. The toy cannot contain food. The toy cannot be kept on the handler during a run and must be placed by the ring exit in a way that it is not to be used as a target.

Toys are allowed during FEO runs only. Toys are not allowed to be thrown and cannot contain squeakers.

All dogs must be under control (ie. penned, crated, or leashed) when not in the ring. There will be no refunds if the dog or handler is dismissed from competition for any reason.

Electronic timing, two-piece jumps, breakaway tire and rubberized contacts will be used at the trial.

Breakaway tire will be set one jump height lower than dogs measured height.

Refund on trial entry fee policy

- If the dog's entry is withdrawn prior to the closing date of the trial, the e-transfer will not be processed. You can choose to let it expire or cancel it. (no Vet Cert. required)
- If the dog gets injured after the trial has started, there will be no refund of fees as participants have signed a waiver acknowledging that there are risks with participating in any competitive sport.
- If the dog gets injured and/or becomes ill after the Closing Date of the Trial BUT before the trial begins, a refund may be issued when a vet certificate is provided.
- Handlers who decide to withdraw bitches in season for any reason after trial closes will be offered a refund or credit to a future trial.
- If the trial is canceled refunds will be provided.
- **A 2.00 administration fee will be withheld from entries on all refunds.**

NOTE: Extenuating circumstances may be considered and the CAANS executive will review each situation on a case-by-case basis.

Entries

- The Canine Agility Association of Nova Scotia (CAANS) reserves the right to refuse any entry.

- Anyone not in good standing with AAC / CAANS will not be allowed to enter the trial.
- By AAC rules, entries are not valid until payment of entry fees has been received or confirmed.
- If you obtain a title on Saturday, you may move up to the next level on Sunday. A move-up page will be available at the results table and must be filled prior to close of day Saturday.
- There will be no day of trial entries.

AAC CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

- Starters: Open to dogs that have not earned an ADC title.
- Advanced: Open to dogs that have earned an ADC.
- Masters: Open to dogs that have earned an AADC title.
- Regular: Dogs will jump standard heights and course times as set by AAC rules.
- Specials: Open to all dogs. Course times and jump heights will be as per AAC rules.
- Veterans: For dogs 7 years of age or older in the case of dogs who have been competing in Regular classes; for dogs 5 years of age or older who have been competing in the Specials division for a minimum of one year. Once a dog has entered an official trial in the Veterans division, they may no longer compete in the Regular or Specials divisions. Course times and jump heights will be as per AAC rules.
- Double Drop:
Veterans Those dogs that are in the veteran's class jumping 2 heights below their Regular height.
- FEO: For Exhibition Only. Competitors are offered the option to enter classes "for exhibition only". FEO entries are not eligible to "Q" nor are they eligible for placements. FEO entries will not be judged. FEO participants must have an AAC number in order to enter. **Toys will be allowed. However, they cannot be thrown or contain squeakers. No food, including bait pouches or toys containing food will be permitted.** Course must be attempted as numbered.

JUNIOR HANDLERS

- Junior Handlers must have their own AAC Junior Handler ID.
- A handler entered in the junior class may not compete in regular classes (including games) at the same AAC trial.
- It is the responsibility of the Junior Handler / Guardian to be aware of the AAC rules pertaining to the Junior Handler Program.

PRIZES

- All classes will receive flat ribbons for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th.
- Ribbons for Qualifying Runs
- Title Patches/Ribbons for dog/handler teams who receive an AAC title. CAANS offers a number of ribbons for the various levels of accomplishment from AAC trials. These ribbons are offered to anyone (CAANS or non-CAANS members) who obtains the final Q for any of these titles at a CAANS trial.
